
What is Neighbourhood Watch?

A person who lives in a community that helps raise awareness and actively encourages people to take action

A Neighbourhood Watch Community Champion will actively promote Crime Prevention advice and ways to reduce opportunities for crime. Working in partnership with local partners and NW



What is a Community Champion's role?

Various online learning programmes, project sessions with NW to learn about crime prevention and how to communicate it to communities

Bringing your learning to life, engaging with your community to raise awareness, increase sense of wellbeing and improve community resilience

Be able to navigate people to local resources and groups to improve community resilience to crime and promote wellbeing





Start by building your knowledge at a range of workshops, online courses and engagement with NW and local policing teams


