ARE YOU OKAY?

Standing up to street harassment



This August we are calling on Neighbourhood Watch members and volunteers, as well as members of the public, to come together and stand against street harassment.

Violence against women and girls (VAWG) continues to be a very real threat across England and Wales. Figures released by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) show that for the year ending March 2023, there were 195,315 sexual offences recorded by the police, a 20% increase from the year ending March 2020.

Of the respondents to our Neighbourhood Watch Crime and Community Survey 2022 who had been a victim of crime in the previous 12 months, 36% had experienced street harassment. When broken down by age, we see that for the majority of 16-24 year olds, their biggest worry is being harassed, threatened, or verbally abused in the street. Over half of our survey respondents (65%) were worried about assault, which shows a decrease from last year's survey results, but also shows that this is still an urgent issue across England and Wales.

All forms of harassment are unacceptable, and we need to take a stand against it.

WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT IT?

There are many ways we can call out and prevent harassment safely, irrespective of age, sexual orientation, gender, race, or ethnicity. We can make a difference. Together.

By street harassment, we mean unwanted behaviour in public areas. Behaviour doesn't have to be illegal for it to be harassment, although some harassment is a crime.

To thank you for your support and time, the ONS will give you a £50 voucher for taking part.






help me Angela is a personal safety service, available to everyone. Read on to hear how the app's Personal Safety Specialists helped one commuter escape a difficult situation...





One Friday night, Kate* was travelling home by train when two drunk men began making sexually aggressive comments towards her. When she moved carriages, they followed her, and when she got off at her stop, they did too.

Feeling intimidated, Kate used the 'help me' button' on the app and sought immediate help from a Personal Safety Specialist. Using the optional GPS service, the team were able to guide Kate to a nearby supermarket and call her a taxi, while the two men decided to walk away. The next day, help me Angela contacted Kate to check in and offer her follow up support.
