We've also been given £250 worth of charity shop gift cards to distribute which we'll use to support vulnerable communities.



Call Blockers - Cyberhood Watch Case study

Keeping our older, vulnerable neighbours safe, is something we can all get on board with, but for Cyberhood Watch Ambassador, Aaron Cain, and his wife, Jennifer, their partnership working led to a fantastic result.

Jennifer works with Guide Dogs for the Blind, supporting blind people in the community who don't have Guide Dogs in their lives. In her work, she found that one of the people she was helping was being targeted by scammers. As with most visually impaired people who are in their later years, they rely on landline phones to keep in touch with family, friends and local services, but with the use of a landline comes the continual nuisance of scam calls leaving many worried about picking up the receiver.

Jennifer and Aaron were able to jump on an email from one of our partners - Friends against Scams - who offer free call-blockers to those at risk. The blockers are given on a case-by-case basis, but the couple's compelling case ensured that a call-blocker was packed up and posted almost immediately for evaluation of its potential in-situ.

Aaron explains: "Using my role as a Cyberhood Watch Ambassador, I quickly completed the online application and received an answer almost immediately that a unit had been approved and dispatched. The unit with the accompanying documentation allowed us to evaluate its capabilities and assess the benefits and potential considerations of its use in the household.

"The benefits of providing the security of a blocker, for any vulnerable person, including those enrolled with Guide Dogs for the Blind, adds peace of mind and allows them to enjoy their lives more fully without being targeted by scammers."



About the Call Blockers

These units can block up to 99% of scam and nuisance calls, giving consumers peace of mind and more time in their day.

It's not surprising that Amazon phone scams have become so common: Amazon is a retail giant. Plus, the more people who shop on the site, the more opportunities there are for criminals to con them out of their financial information.

There are several versions of the Amazon call scam. But in all of them, a scammer's goal is to steal your personal and financial information. A con artist might call you to say that someone has used your Amazon account to order an expensive item and because the purchase was so large, the representative says, Amazon needs to verify that you made the order.

When you tell the representative that you did not make the order, the scammer will ask for your Amazon account log-in information and credit card number. The scammer will explain that this information is necessary to cancel the order and protect your account from further fraudulent activities. If you provide this information, the scammer can later access your Amazon account to run up illegal purchases in your name.

Red flags to watch for - Amazon itself provides several <u>warning</u> <u>signs</u> of a call scam:

- 1. It's about an order you never placed
- 2. The caller asks for your personal information
- 3. The caller is vague about what you ordered
- 4. The caller is pressuring you to act quickly
- 5. The call is a recorded message
- If you've fallen victim to an Amazon call scam, act quickly to limit the financial damage.
- First, check your bank/credit card statements. Look for any suspicious purchases that you know you didn't make, and contact your bank if there are.
- Consider downloading credit reports, check them for any new loans or credit card accounts that you know you haven't opened. Report any fraudulent loans or accounts to the credit companies.

It's alarming to know that the police record over 500 burglaries every day in the UK. So, it's a good idea to take a moment to think about your home security during this time of the year.

GROUND-BREAKING POLICE FRAMEWORK

Neighbourhood Watch has worked with the National Neighbourhood Policing Leads to produce a 'Framework.' The Framework acts as a building block for better relationships and working practices between our volunteers and Police at a local level.

This work began in response to the many requests from Police Officers,
Neighbourhood Watch Associations, and volunteers, for nationally agreed guidance on good practice, liaison and working together.

The Framework contains commitments from both Police and Neighbourhood Watch to work together to share information, to encourage communities to join their local neighbourhood watches, or to create their own. Importantly, it also commits them to

get involved with both crime prevention and community support activities – sharing advice and information with residents to help them keep themselves and their property safe.

John Hayward-Cripps, CEO of Neighbourhood Watch says: "This was a very important piece of work and one that we are extremely proud of – it strengthens our connection with Police Forces and demonstrates our commitment to tackle crime to achieve safer more connected communities."
